

**Diocesan Episcopal Nominee “Walk About”
October 11, 2018 - October 13, 2018

Each visit will have the same basic protocol despite differences in locations and times. At each session, each Candidate will take about 30 minutes to respond to questions posed by the moderators. After both candidates have spoken, a reception will follow allowing delegates, clergy, and members of the diocese to interact more informally with the candidates and their wives.

Candidate will respond to 5 or 6 questions. 3 questions will be drawn from a set of questions asked by the CNB and made known to the candidates in advance. 2 or 3 questions will be selected from a set of **questions submitted by members of the diocese** (laity, delegates, or clergy) which will not be made known to the candidates in advance.

Update on Upcoming Election of New Bishop

In June 2017, Bishop Bill Murdoch announced his retirement and confirmed that he would call for the election of a new bishop in an 18-month process. That work is now almost complete.

The Committee on Nominations for Bishop (CNB) has now selected the final two candidates for election, the Rev. Andrew Williams and the Rev. Canon Dr. Thomas Herrick. An overview of each candidate is on the next two pages of this insert.

Drew Williams began his professional life as a lawyer in the United Kingdom. From 1989-1998, Drew was a corporate litigator specializing in defending lawsuits brought against the legal profession. Despite a successful career, it was during this time that Drew began to sense that something significant was missing in his life, and much to the surprise of Drew and his wife, Elena, they found themselves drawn into something far deeper, and ultimately came to a living faith in God through the love, support and friendship of their Anglican Parish. A time of discernment followed, and after much prayer and strong

encouragement from those who knew him, Drew resigned from his law firm and began training for ordination at Trinity College, Bristol. He graduated with an honors degree in theology and was ordained in the Diocese of Exeter in 2000. Drew spent six years as Associate Vicar (Pastor) of St. Andrew's, Chorleywood, a vibrant suburban congregation just outside London. Prior to coming to Chorleywood, he served a congregation in the southwest of England. Since October 2009, Drew Williams has been the Senior Pastor of Trinity Church in Greenwich, CT with a particular area of focus in developing and overseeing a new outreach strategy through the creation and support of Mission Shaped Communities (MSC's) led by lay-persons that broaden and multiply the ministry of his congregations and have led to significant growth in both depth and numbers.

Tom Herrick is the Executive Director of the Titus Institute for Church Planting, a ministry dedicated to establishing a church multiplication movement in North America. He is a church planter and has served as a catalyst for church multiplication at the regional and national levels since 1995. His work includes coaching and training church planters and network leaders, training and certifying coaches, performing assessments for prospective planters, developing strategic plans for churches, networks and dioceses, and teaching church planting for several seminaries in MDiv and DMin degree programs. Tom has

planted churches in Houston, TX and Centreville, VA, and served in various capacities of leadership: 9 years serving on the Church Planting Commission of the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia (serving as Chairman 6 of those years), 4 years as National Director for Church Planting with the Anglican Communion Network, and the past 7+ years as Executive Director of the Titus Institute for Church Planting. Tom serves as adjunct professor for church planting and teaches Masters and Doctoral courses at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, where he earned his Doctor of Ministry degree in Church Planting, and at Nashotah House Theological Seminary. Tom is a frequent conference speaker whose passion is to spread the vision for Great Commission Church Multiplication.
